Content and Filtering

- 1. This Chromebook is not a private device it is owned and monitored by CVSD; it's use should also be monitored by parents/guardians.
- 2. School-related extensions come preloaded on this Chromebook. Other approved extensions can be downloaded from the Chrome Store.
- 3. YouTube is used for instructional videos. However, YouTube can become a black hole of video watching. You may want to consider whether you want your child to use it.
- 4. The Chromebook has content filtering on the home and school networks through Go Guardian. Please note that no filter is perfect and home monitoring should occur.
- 5. If students use inappropriate language in their emails, it will be flagged for CVSD administration.
- 6. Email is allowed only within the CVSD domain. Students may not send or receive emails to accounts outside of the CVSD email domain.

Key Points

Setting Up the Chromebook for Home Use

- Connect to your home Internet under Control Panel.
- Review your child's Google Classroom.

Set Boundaries

- Limit the time your student is on the Chromebook.
- Suggest that Chromebooks are not taken to bed and use in a common area.
- Help your child develop a routine.
- Check the history in Google Chrome to see sites your child visited.

Share the Experience

- Ask your child to teach you how they use the Chromebook.
- Ask your child to demonstrate the way they use their Chromebook at school.
- Play with the Chromebook yourself.
