


Class of 2021-2022 Graduation Pathways

***On October 24, 2018, Senate Bill 1095 was signed into law. This Bill shifts the requirement that standardized testing will determine graduation for high schools students to the provision that allows for the expansion of options for students to demonstrate postsecondary readiness.**



OPTION #1

*Student must score Proficient on all three Keystone Exams

**•Scoring Proficient
on the Algebra 1, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams**

OPTION #2

Approved Assessments: SAT, PSAT, ACT, or ASVAB

Advanced Coursework: AP, IB, concurrent enrollment courses, pre-apprenticeship, or acceptance in a 4-yr nonprofit institution of higher education for college-level coursework

- **Passing grades on Keystone Courses**
- **Completion of approved assessment**
- **Advanced Coursework**

OPTION #3

Three Pieces of Evidence from Career Portfolio: Must align to student goals and career plan. Examples include ACT WorkKeys, SAT Subject tests, AP, IB and concurrent coursework, or higher education acceptance.

- Passing grades on Keystone Courses
- Three pieces of evidence in career portfolio

OPTION #4

NOCTI: National Occupational Competency Testing Institute

NIMS: National Institute of Metalworking Skills

- **Passing grades on Keystone Courses**

- **Pass the NOCTI or NIMS**

OPTION #5

Under Act 158 of 2018, a student may demonstrate proficiency for high school graduation through the Keystone Composite Pathway by earning a satisfactory composite score of **4452** on the Algebra 1, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams

Student must also achieve at least a proficient score on one of the three exams and no less than a basic score on the remaining
two

- **Earning a satisfactory composite score on the Keystone Exam**
